FOUNDATIONS OF FAITH

WEEK 3 - CHRISTOLOGY

<u>DEFINITION OF CHRISTOLOGY:</u> The Doctrine/Study of Christ (nature, character, attributes, incarnation).

CHRISTOLOGY OF THE GOSPEL WRITERS

- Matthew Jesus is the <u>King</u> who has come to bring in the kingdom (His royalty)
- 2. Mark Jesus has come as a lowly Servant (His humility)
- 3. Luke Jesus is the Man who has come to save (His humanity)
- 4. John Jesus is the Son of God (His deity)

NATURE OF CHRIST

- A. John 1: 1-3 (read)
 - 1. Christ is eternal
 - 2. Christ co-existed with God
 - 3. Christ is God
 - 4. Christ is creator

B. Paul's Epistles

- 1. Col. 2:9 All the fullness of God dwelt in Him bodily.
- 2. Col. 1:15 He is the <u>firstborn</u> of all creation (means He <u>inherits</u> all things and is before all others).
- 3. Col. 1:17 He is before all things (He exists eternally).
- 4. Phil. 2:6-8
 - a) Jesus was in His very nature God.
 - b) He did not have to grasp to be <u>equal</u> with God, because He was God; He did not <u>demand</u> or <u>cling to</u> His rights as God.
 - c) He made Himself <u>nothing</u> ,took upon Himself the form of a <u>servant</u>, and was made in <u>human likeness</u>.
 - d) He was in the appearance of a <u>man</u>, He <u>humbled</u> Himself, and was obedient to the death of the cross.

RELATIONSHIP OF CHRIST IN THE TRINITY

- 1. He is the SECOND PERSON of the Godhead (Trinity) ... (Matt. 28:19).
- 2. He is ONE with God ... (John 10:30).
- 3. He is the ONLY BEGOTTEN Son of God ... (John 3: 16) not created by God.
- 4. He is CREATOR ... (John 1:3 all things were made by Him; Heb. 1:2 God made the universe through His Son; 1 Cor. 8:6 all things came through Jesus Christ).
- 5. He is SUSTAINER ... (Col. 1:17 in Him all things consist) -- if Christ stops existing, there is no more universe!

CHRIST IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

- 1. He is referred to as <u>Yahweh</u> (Psalms 68:18; Eph. 4:8-10; Jer. 23:5-6; 1 Cor. 1:30; Zech. 12:10; Rev. 1:7) ... this speaks of God's <u>holiness</u>, <u>nearness</u>, and <u>love</u> -- Jesus Christ is the u<u>ltimate expression</u> of these things.
- 2. He is referred to as <u>Elohim</u> (Isaiah 40:3; Psalms 68:18) ... this speaks of God's divine majesty and power -- Jesus Christ shares in these things.
- 3. He is referred to as <u>Adonai</u> (Mal. 3:1; Psalms 110:1,4; Heb. 7:17 ... means <u>Lord</u> and <u>Master.</u>
- 4. He is referred to as <u>The Angel of the Lord</u> (Gen. 16:7-13; Gen. 24:7; Judges 5:23) ... these were appearances of GOD the SON before His birth as a human.

THE INCARNATION OF CHRIST

- 1. DEFINITION:
 - * God <u>became</u> man, <u>not</u> God was <u>turned into</u> a man, or God <u>stopped</u> being God and <u>started</u> being man ... but the Word <u>remained</u> God and took on a <u>human</u> nature, uniting this to His <u>divine</u> nature in ONE person Jesus Christ.
- 2. HIS DIVINE NATURE:

Col. 2:9 - <u>ALL</u> we can say about God we must say about <u>Christ</u> ... He is FULLY GOD! (in essence, nature and attributes)

- 3. HIS HUMAN NATURE: (From secular definition of humanity)
 - a) Physical body (John 1:14; John 4:9)
 - b) Conscious being with ongoing thought life
 - c) Rational, moral and spiritual capacities (Luke 2:52)
 - d) Genuine human life with growth and maturity (Heb. 5:7-8)
 - e) Human knowledge with increase and development (Luke 2:40)
 - f) Subject to temptation (Heb. 4:15)
 - g) Enduring nature beyond this life (Matt. 26:37-39; Mark 8:12)

CHARACTERISTICS OF CHRIST

- 1. Related to God in the most intimate way possible -- called God" My Father" (Luke 2:49).
- 2. Worthy of all honor given to God (John 5:22, 23).
- 3. Power over life, and equal with God (John 5:21).
- 4. Came to bring salvation (Matt. 20:28).
- 5. Power over death (Matt. 16:21).
- 6. Power over the <u>religious</u> system (Matt. 12:6,8); power over the <u>kingdom</u> of Satan (Matt. 12:24-28); power to forgive sins (Mark 2:5-10).
- 7. Divine knowledge (John 1:27, 42; 2:25; Mark 10:21; Luke 7:37-40).

NAMES OF CHRIST

- 1. JESUS same as the Hebrew <u>Joshua</u> .. means .. <u>Yahweh saves</u> .. (Matt. 1 :21); He was named by God the Father (Luke 1 :30-31).
- 2. JESUS OF NAZARETH Nazareth was a small, remote <u>village</u> in the rural, unsophisticated province of <u>Galilee</u> this shows us the incredible <u>humanity</u> Jesus embraced in becoming a man.
- 3. JESUS CHRIST Christ is the same as the Hebrew Messiah, which means Anointed One II, or someone set apart for a specific task.
- 4. IMMANUEL means "God With Us" --- Jesus had literally come to be with us and live with us as Almighty God, and yet as a Man.
